# ASCI to work with OECD Development Centre on Pioneering Sports Investment Initiative in Africa

The African Sports and Creative Institute (ASCI) is set to formalize an initiative with the OECD Development Centre as a knowledge partner for sports industry matters in Africa. This groundbreaking partnership aims at developing data and intelligence to help public and private sector leaders better understand and harness sports as a powerful vehicle for socio-economic growth.

The initiative will feature the ambitious "**Road to 5**" project. "Road to 5" brand name epitomizes the vision of a future Africa where sports contribute to 5% of the continent GDP.

The Road to 5 Project led by OECD Development Centre and ASCI, in synergies with the International Olympic Committee and AFRISTAT and with financial support from Italy's Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation, aims at measuring the contribution and impact of the sports industry in Africa. The goal is to advance sustainable investments in Africa's sports ecosystem.

The project work will kick off in January 2025. The project aims to address critical information gaps and promote best practices to harness the growing impact of sports on global and regional economies.

With the sports industry contributing approximately 3-5% to global GDP and recording annual growth rates of 5-9%, the "**Road to 5**" project is strategically positioned to help unlock the sector's potential for Africa. This aligns with the <u>Pescara Declaration</u>, endorsed by G7 Development Ministers in October 2024, which emphasizes the importance of sustainable investment in the sports industry as a driver of economic and social progress.

ASCI's involvement underscores the transformative role of sports in creating employment, fostering youth inclusion, and driving sustainable development across the continent. This initiative further cements ASCI's position as a catalyst for innovation and a key player in shaping Africa's sports economy.
